Katie Reynolds from Swansea Bay is the Welsh Orienteering Association's Orienteer of the Year for 2013. After a solid domestic season she was selected to represent Great Britain at the Junior World Orienteering Championships held in the Czech Republic in July. Katie is a stalwart of SBOC and was a key member of the Welsh Junior Squad for many years. Her running speed - she is also a fine steeple chaser brought home many a relay team. As well as her own racing, she has latterly helped on training camps - control hanging etc. She is currently studying at Edinburgh University. Some previous successes are: 2012 - GB team in EYOC, and Welsh Champion, 2008 British Champion - W14, 2005 British champion-W12.

Welsh success at the JIRCs!

This year the Welsh Junior Orienteering Squad had one of their most successful ever JIRCs with Wales coming 4th in the overall standings. Also, the girls' Welsh relay team of Fay Walsh, Elen Norris and Megan Carter-Davies came first, winning the girls relay race, the first time ever Wales have achieved this!

This year the JIRCs was held in South Dorset, organised by Wimborne Orienteers. For the individual competition we travelled to Gore Heath, situated just west of Bournemouth. Gore Heath has a variety of vegetation; some of the forest is very runnable, ensuring some fast times.

The courses included a spectator control situated in a depression at the top of a hill, creating a good cheer from fellow squad members! Well done to Megan Carter-Davies who performed best in the Welsh team, coming 3rd in the W18 course! Also, I think we should thank William Thomas and Quinlan Silk for running up as M14 from M12.

The relays were held on God's Hill near the New Forest on the Sunday. Travelling to the event I spotted many donkeys and the famous New Forest ponies (which we were warned about beforehand), I also saw a deer out on my leg of the relay! It was a very cold day but spirits were high as the anticipation of who would win the relays was looming. As the M16s lined up at the start line you could feel the competitive tension building up. They set off to a rousing cheer and were soon out of sight. The girls set off 15 minutes later, to an equally rousing cheer.

God's Hill includes some very runnable

forested areas but mostly was an open heathland. The run-in from the last control was a straight stretch of short, enabling some impressive sprint finishes!

When Megan came round the corner to the finish control it was hard to believe that we were about to win. Fay and I quickly joined her on the run-in accompanied by the Welsh flag and a loud cheer. Crossing the line Megan said 'Are we 3rd then?' only to be answered with Fay and I screaming that we were FIRST!

It was a very enjoyable weekend made even better with the success of the whole team! I think the Welsh Junior Orienteering Squad are looking forward to competing at the JIRCS' next year!

Welsh Junior Orienteering Squad - Sweden 2013



Easter 2014 sees "the JK" come to Wales again, 16 years after the last time when it was held in and around Dolgellau. This time it's based in South Wales, with the Swansea, Merthyr Tydfil and Blaenavon districts hosting the four races – one more race day since the 1998 JK.

The 1998 JK remains the largest event ever held in Wales with some 3326 competitors on the start line. Many of you will remember that mid-April snow ruined the second individual day and many of the courses had to be cancelled – the first, and we trust last, time this has happened at a JK! But it was a truly excellent competition despite this.

A very healthy entry is expected this year too as there are over 2800 entries currently on the list, over 500 of them attracted from overseas as well. There's a large entry from Welsh clubs too, but mostly from experienced competitors and with not so many newcomers.

So, if you feel that "the JK" is too serious for you, don't worry – it caters for all as its "festival" description implies. It's not too late to enter as the closing date is March 30th, so why not give it a go? There may not be another opportunity "on your home patch" for another 16 years after all!

Senior Squad Report

1. Senior Home Internationals

The senior team competes once a year as a group at the Senior Home Internationals. The 2013 SHI was held in Ireland with the Relays taking place in Carnawaddy and the Individual races on Carlingford Mountain.

Wales Men 1 were in good contention for a podium with Kris Jones coming back 1st on first leg but eventually finished 4th.

Stand-out performance was Kris Jones winning the M21. In the women's class Cerys Manning finished an excellent 4th in W21.

The big challenge of the weekend was a broken ankle to Wales Captain Ed Nicholas at the Relay. The team managed to re-organise hire cars and ensured there was no significant issue with the weekend.

Wales , unfortunately, finished 4th overall and for the first time in some while slipped behind Ireland. A combination of bad luck and missing key indi-viduals resulted in this unfortunate outcome.

The 2014 SHI will be held in Scotland as part of the Race the Castles week. A good chance for further individual glory and a team effort to avenge this year's defeat by the Irish.

2. Senior Wales GB Results in 2013

Wales had two representatives at WOC 2013 with Kris Jones making his debut in the Sprint and Helen Palmer competing in the Middle Distance. In a

team that is 13 in size this continues to be a good level of representation (for comparison Scotland 6; England 5; Northern Ireland 0)

Kris made an excellent debut finishing 16th in the Sprint and certainly he has a good long senior career ahead of himself. Helen Palmer continued her good performances in what was her 6th WOC finishing in 27th in the Long.

In the Orienteering World Cup Helen Palmer represented GB in New Zealand in January 2013. Illness unfortunately prevented her from delivering a good result. Helen also competed at the season-ending World Cup final in Switzerland.

3. Representation at British Senior Squad Level 2014

The two representatives at WOC, Kris and Helen, are both members of the British Orienteering Elite Development Squad and are joined by Anwen Darlington.

Aims of the Senior Squad

Although not stated (in any documentation—Ed), I would like to detail what I believe the aims of the Senior Squad are:

- 1. To ensure that we have a competitive team at the Senior Home Internationals
- 2. To support wherever possible Welsh athletes in Great Britain Teams and Squads
- Support the transition of athletes from the Junior Team/Squad to the Senior Team/Squad

The Squad continues to have a number of athletes who are world level athletes and we commend their performances and efforts. There continues to be a challenge in the strength in depth with non full teams/low strength teams attending the Senior Home Internationals. There remains work to be done to continue the great work done by the Junior Squad and transfer athletes into the Senior Team.

Welsh Veteran Orienteering Team

Wales produced its best ever result at the Veteran Home International (VHI) in Norfolk on $5^{th}/6^{th}$ October 2013, finishing in second place to England and ahead of Scotland and Ireland.

There were some very strong individual performances and the team dominated with first and second in both the M40 and W50 classes, and a first in the W40 class.

Priorities for 2014 are:

- Order new team kit as several newer team members do not have Welsh O kit. This is probably best done in collaboration with the Welsh senior and junior teams.
- Develop the potential for even better performances through arranging an O training weekend for existing and potential future team members.

Under the traditional arrangements of each home nation hosting the VHI in rotation Wales would be due to host in 2014. WOA has agreed to concede and England will host the VHI in the Forest of Dean on 14/15 September 2014. We understand WOA will host the VHI in 2015 and look forward to this being confirmed soon.
